With SFSU adviser approval, up to 9 units of lower division transfer courses may be counted toward the major as elective units or potentially, within a depth of study. For all majors, ENGL 1B or 5 will meet a prerequisite to the upper division graduation writing requirement.

SAN JOSE STATE UNIVERSITY

B.A. Communication Studies

The Communication Studies major is Impacted. All eligible applicants must have an overall transfer GPA of at least 2.6.

The major has no lower division course requirements beyond completion of lower division general education. The Communication Studies Department will accept up to 8 semester units of lower division Speech Communication courses as electives in the major that are not also used to satisfy lower division general education requirements. Students may select up to 8 semester units from the following courses, but the transfer courses may not be double-counted for both G.E. and major electives: SPCH 1A or 60, SPCH 3A, COMM 7.

Lower Division support courses required for Preparation for Teaching: ENGL 46.1 or 46.2 **and** ENGL 30.1 or 30.2

All students: ENGL 1B or 5 or PHIL 5 or SPCH 9 = prerequisite to upper division writing.

SJSU also requires 2 units of PE in at least two different activities for graduation.

Admission of transfer applicants to this major is competitive. CSU GE or IGETC (including graduation requirements in U.S. History, U.S. Constitution, and California State & Local Government) should be completed prior to transfer. UC BERKELEY

B.A. Media Studies

The Media Studies major at Berkeley is not a media production major. Rather, it uses perspectives from the social sciences and humanities to examine the mass media. Admission to Berkeley does not guarantee admission to a particular major. Students must submit a separate application to the department after arrival at Berkeley.

Departmental-level admission to the Media Studies major is competitive. Students must present strong grades in prerequisite courses. Additionally, students who have completed 70 units or more or whose GPA in the prerequisite and other relevant courses falls below 3.2 must submit a graded research paper (at least 5 pages in length) with their application in order to demonstrate that they possess the critical writing and research skills necessary to succeed in upper division courses. AP scores cannot be used to satisfy the major prerequisites.

Complete by the end of the spring term preceding fall enrollment at Berkeley either (1) The College of Letters & Science Requirements in Reading & Composition, Foreign Language, and Quantitative Reasoning, or (2) IGETC.

Prerequisites: HIST 17.2; POLS 1; *One selection from* ANTHRO 2 or 30, ECON 1A+1B, PSYCH 1A, SOC 1; take MEDIAST 10 at UCB.

UC DAVIS

A.B. Communication

Selective major: Transfer students must complete the following courses by the end of spring term prior to fall enrollment at UCD, with letter grades of C or higher and a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 for this group of courses:

ENGL 25; MATH 15; PSYCH 1A; SOC 1.

Additional preparation: SPCH 1A or COMM 6

Earn a minimum transfer overall GPA of 2.8 or higher to be a competitive applicant.

UC LOS ANGELES

B.A. Communication Studies

This major is highly selective. Applications undergo review by faculty in the Communication Studies Department. A minimum UC-transferable cumulative GPA of 3.50 is required for faculty review. All work pertaining to the major must be taken for a letter grade. A minimum of four courses must be completed by the fall term prior to admission.

Lower Division requirements: COMM 10; MATH 15; SPCH 1A; *Three selected from* POLS 1, PSYCH 1A, SOC 1, ECON 1B

UC SANTA BARBARA

B.A. Communication

Students are admitted initially to the pre-major. Students will not be admitted to full Communication major status until they complete UCSB's Communication 1*, 87**, 88, and 89, with no grade below C- and with a GPA of at least 3.00 for those courses completed at UCSB. General Education may be satisfied by completion of IGETC prior to transfer.

Pre-major course requirements: COMM 10* = COMM 1; MATH 15** is accepted for COMM 87
