B.S. in Apparel Design and Merchandising

Major is impacted. Students must apply between October 1 and November 30 for admission to the following fall term. See departmental website for details and due dates of the required additional application at <http://cfsd.sfsu.edu>.

All major courses must be passed with a letter grade of C- or better. Second year written composition (ENGL 1B or 5) with a grade of C- or better is required to begin the sequence of upper division ADM courses.

Lower Division Prerequisites: ART 7A; ECON 1A, 1B; INDE 20; PSYCH 1A

Lower Division Core: FASH 8, 50 (*Apparel Design Emphasis* also take FASH 70A)

Lower Division Electives: BAD 1, 2; CS 84.21; FASH 56A

B.A. in Family Consumer Sciences

Courses required for this major (or concentration/emphasis) are upper division level courses at SFSU. Some of these courses may have prerequisite requirements that may be met at the lower division level.

Prior to transfer, complete the lower division CSU GE requirements for certification including ENGL 1B or 5 (meets a prerequisite to the upper division writing requirement), U.S. History, POLS 1.

LIR 10 or 30 will satisfy a graduation requirement in Basic Information Competency.
