### **SAN DIEGO STATE UNIVERSITY**

#### **B.S. in Applied Arts and Sciences, Major in Television, Film and New Media**

**Emphasis in Critical Studies:** THAR 1\*, 2\*; MEDIA 42\*: \*One additional course that is not articulated

**Emphasis in Production:** THAR 1, 2\*; MEDIA 42\*, 77, 79A; Two additional courses that are not articulated

**IMPACTED programs – For admission, in addition to 60 transferable units including full GE certification:**

- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or higher.
- Complete above courses marked with \* with letter grades of "B" or higher (cannot be taken CR/NC).
- Production Emphasis
  - Complete a personal statement and submit two letters of recommendation to be evaluated by the faculty;
  - Submit samples of visual creative work;
  - Submit a treatment for a 1-3 minute production (fiction or nonfiction).

### **SAN FRANCISCO STATE UNIVERSITY**

#### **B.A. in Cinema - Department of Cinema**

Cinema (Film) is high demand (not impacted). Please check the SFSU Bulletin, the SFSU website at [www.sfsu.edu/](http://www.sfsu.edu/), or the Cinema Department for application filing periods.

At the time of admission to the University no special permission, application or portfolio is required to declare a major in Cinema. However, before advancing to the 300-level or higher courses in the Cinema program, all declared Cinema majors must:

- Complete the SFSU prerequisite core course CINE 203 with a grade of "C" or better.
- Complete lower division GE requirements.

Note: ENGL 1B or 5 is a prerequisite to the upper division graduation writing course in the major.

#### **B.A. in Broadcast and Electronic Communication Arts**

Broadcast and Electronic Communication Arts is high demand (not impacted). Applications are accepted from **OCTOBER 1 - NOVEMBER 30** for the following fall and **AUGUST 1 – SEPTEMBER 30** for the following spring. Applications received outside of these filing periods will not be considered.

Students majoring in Radio and Television are encouraged to take additional coursework in other disciplines related to their program of study in Broadcast and Electronic Communication Arts. Students should also develop strong writing skills.

- The prerequisite core courses (BECA 200 = MEDIA 4 at SRJC, 300, 340) must be completed before enrolling in the production sequence, so transfer students should plan to take them their first semester at SFSU.
- Completion of ENGL 1B or 5 (C or better) or passing the JEPET at SFSU is a prerequisite to BECA 300 at SFSU.
- MEDIA 79A and MUSC 51A are articulated to meet lower division core foundation requirements.

### **SAN JOSE STATE UNIVERSITY**

#### **B.A. in Radio-Television-Film (RTVF)**

2.60 minimum cumulative GPA is required for admission consideration.

**Lower division requirements for the major:** MEDIA 41

ENGL 1B or 5, PHIL 5 or SPCH 9 is a prerequisite for upper division writing at SJSU.

A minor in a related area approved by the advisor and the selected minor department is required. Suggested areas include Drama, Journalism, Advertising, Public Relations, Speech Communication, Business Administration, Photography, Psychology, Sociology, Political Science, History, English, and Art. Any area that provides content support to the art, science and business of electronic media is acceptable.

Note: SJSU requires 2 units of PE in at least two different activities for graduation.

## **UC DAVIS**

### **A. B. in Film Studies**

#### **Lower Division Courses:**

- Media 42
- Four-course sequence in a single language or equivalent
- One course from the following: COUN 20 or ENGL 31 or 33
- One course from the following: ANTHRO 32, 43; COUN 20, ENGL 31, 33; HIST 26, 30; PSYCH 3
- Two courses from the following: ANTHRO 43; ART 2.1, 2.2, 2.3; ENGL 2; HIST 1.2, 17.2, 18.2; THAR 1; **OR** one of these two courses may be from ART 3; THAR 10A

**Note: A course may only be used in one area.**

## **UC IRVINE**

### **B.A. in Film and Media Studies**

*This major does not require the completion of prerequisites for admission as a transfer student.*

The following courses are articulated preparation:

**Two years of language other than English:** ASL 4, FREN 4, GERM 4, ITAL 4, LATIN 4, or SPAN 4

#### **Select at least one course from each area:**

Writing: ENGL 1A, 1B, 5; PHIL 5; SPCH 9

Literature: ENGL 2, 3, 30.1, 30.2, 46.1, 46.2

History: HIST 1.1, 1.2, 4.1, 4.2, 17.1, 17.2

Philosophy: PHIL 6, 7, 20, 21

## **UCLA**

### **B.A. in Film and Television**

Undergraduates in the film and television program take courses in: critical studies - the history, theory, and aesthetics of both film and television; production - film, television (studio and field), digital, experimental, and animation; and film and television craft - writing, directing, cinematography, and editing. **Recommended courses prior to entrance include: American film history, European film history, American television history, and one theater course.**

Additional admission requirements include a personal essay, a critical essay, a creative writing sample, and two letters of recommendation. *Films and videotapes are not accepted.* Prior experience is not required. Applicants to the school must have a minimum 3.0 GPA at the time of application and must complete their general education coursework prior to entrance. **Completion of IGETC plus foreign language proficiency and literature courses are recommended.**

## **UC SANTA CRUZ**

### **BA - Film and Digital Media**

No lower division major requirements are articulated at this time. All transfer students must enroll in at least one lower-division course (20A, 20B or 20C) during their first quarter at UCSC. As preparation for the major, prospective transfer students are encouraged to fulfill at least one of those lower division film and digital major requirements through UCSC Summer Session prior to transfer. After completion of one of those courses with a grade of B- or better, transfer students may declare the film and digital media pre-major.
