Students preparing for the Single Subject Secondary Education program in history, take: HIST 8.2, 17.1, 17.2; GEOG 7; POLS 2, 18

HIST 1.1+1.2 or 4.1+4.2
HIST 17.1, 17.2

SAN DIEGO STATE UNIVERSITY

Impacted major – minimum cumulative GPA of 2.40 is required.

Complete with a letter grade of “C” or higher and a GPA of 2.20 or higher HIST 1.1 & 1.2 and six units from HIST 4.1, 4.2, 17.1, 17.2.

Successful completion of a 3rd college semester of one foreign language is required for graduation.

SAN FRANCISCO STATE UNIVERSITY

HIST 1.1+1.2 or 4.1+4.2
HIST 17.1, 17.2

ENGL 1B or 5 meets a prerequisite to the upper division graduation writing requirement in the major.

SAN JOSE STATE UNIVERSITY

Impacted major – minimum cumulative GPA of 2.30 required for admission consideration.

HIST 1.1+1.2 or 4.1+4.2

ENGL 1B or 5 or PHIL 5 or SPCH 9 = prerequisite for upper division writing.

SJSU also requires 2 units of PE in at least two different activities for graduation.

UC BERKELEY

One course must be completed from each of four areas:

- I. United States = HIST 17.1, 17.2
- II. Europe/Western Civilization = HIST 4.1, 4.2
- III. Asia, Africa or Latin America = HIST 8.1 or 33, 8.2 or 33
- IV. Elective = one additional course from area I, II, or III (other than the course used to satisfy the area prerequisite).

Complete either (1) the College of Letters & Science requirements in Reading & Composition, Foreign Language, and Quantitative Reasoning or (2) IGETC by the end of the spring term preceding fall enrollment at UCB.

UC DAVIS

Five lower division courses, including at least two from one field, one from a second field, and one from a third field. The fifth course can be taken from any field:

- A. African and Middle East History = no comparable course
 - B. Asian History = no comparable course
 - C. European History = no comparable course
 - D. Latin American History = HIST 8.2
 - E. U.S. History = HIST 17.1 or 18.1, 17.2 or 18.2
 - F. World History = HIST 1.2

UC IRVINE

Two courses from two different regions from: HIST 1.1, 1.2, 4.1, 4.2, 17.1, 17.2

Note: A third course in another region will be taken at UCI.

Up to three additional transferable history courses

One course from: ASL 4, FREN 4, GERM 4, ITAL 4, LATIN 4, or SPAN 4

At least one course from each of the following areas:

Writing: ENGL 1A, 1B, 5; PHIL 5; SPCH 9

Literature: ENGL 2, 3, 30.1, 30.2, 46.1, 46.2

History: HIST 1.1, 1.2, 4.1, 4.2, 17.1, 17.2

Philosophy: PHIL 6, 7, 20, 21

UC LOS ANGELES

One course from: HIST 1.1, 1.2, 4.1, or 4.2

Two courses from: HIST 8.1, 8.2, 20, 21, 22, 30, 33, 17.1 or 18.1, 17.2 or 18.2

One course in Introduction to Historical Practice: No course articulated; must be taken at UCLA

UC SANTA BARBARA

Select two of the following three sequences:

1. *History of World Civilization* = HIST 1.1+1.2
2. *History of Western Civilization* = HIST 4.1+4.2
3. *History of the U.S.* = HIST 17.1+17.2

Select one lower-division course from: HIST 8.1, 8.2, 33

Select one or two additional UC transferable courses from the History Department not already applied toward the major.

UC SANTA CRUZ - Based on 2010-12 catalog requirements and 2009-10 articulation

Transfer students may apply up to three history courses toward the major, with no more than two courses from any single region of concentration from the three listed below:

1. The Americas and Africa = HIST 8.1, 8.2, 17.1 or 18.1, 17.2 or 18.2, 20, 21, 22, 30, 33
2. Europe = HIST 4.1, 4.2
3. Asia and the Islamic World = No courses articulated

Note: HIST 1.1 and 1.2 may be accepted toward the major; Consult with the UCSC History Dept. advisor.

Proficiency in a foreign language is strongly recommended and is essential for those planning to pursue graduate studies.
