<b>CSU CHICO</b> <i>B.A. International Relations</i>	ECON 1A or 1B	Two years of foreign language or the equivalent of the 4 <sup>th</sup> semester of a college level program. Language units may be waived with demonstrated proficiency.
<b>CSU EAST BAY</b> <i>B.A. International Studies</i>	ECON 1A or 1B; ANTHRO 2 or GEOG 7	Oral and written proficiency in a modern foreign language equivalent to two full years of university-level studies. May be fulfilled by course completion or exam.
<b>CSU LONG BEACH</b> <i>B.A. International Studies</i>	ECON 1A & 1B; 9 units from ANTHRO 2, HIST 1.2, GEOG 3 or 7, POL 2	Three years of college level study or proficiency in a language appropriate to the program of study and geographic area. CSU GE Area A & B4 must be completed by end of the prior spring semester for fall admission or by end of the prior summer for spring admission. Admission is competitive.
<b>SONOMA STATE UNIVERSITY</b> <i>B.A. Global Studies</i>	ECON 1A; ANTHRO 2 or GEOG 7; GEOG 4 or ENVS 12	Students must earn a C- or better in any course applied to the major. Intermediate-level or higher proficiency in a modern foreign language by exam or by completing a 4 <sup>th</sup> semester course. Students choosing a European Concentration with an emphasis in France, Iberia, or Central/Eastern Europe must demonstrate advanced proficiency in the language of the respective culture (French, Spanish, German or other appropriate language) by passing an advanced-level proficiency exam or completing a 3 <sup>rd</sup> year language course sequence.
<b>UC DAVIS</b> <i>A.B. International Relations</i>	ECON 1A; ECON 1B* or ANTHRO 2; HIST 1.2; MATH 15; POL 25	Transfers must complete all of the listed courses with a letter grade of C or higher and GPA of at least 3.0 by the spring term prior to fall enrollment at UCD. Foreign Language - one series in a single language: FREN 1 - 4; ITAL 1 - 4; SPAN 1 - 4; GERM 1 - 4 + GERMAN 21 at UCD. To be competitive, students must have a minimum transfer overall GPA of 2.8 or higher. Note: Preparatory subject matter does not cover all potential prerequisite courses for upper division curriculum. ECON 1B* and calculus are prerequisites for some courses. Consult the UCD catalog or an advisor.
<b>UCLA</b> <i>B.A. Global Studies</i>	MATH 15; Complete thru 4 <sup>th</sup> semester of any modern foreign language; (1) *Culture & Society: ANTHRO 2, GEOG 7 (2) *Governance & Conflict: HIST 1.2, POLS 2, 18, 25, SOC 1 (3) *Markets: ECON 1A, 1B	This is a highly selective major. Transfer students are admitted as Pre-Global Studies majors. Transfer applicants must complete a minimum of six major prep courses by the spring term prior to admission. All courses must be completed with letter grades. * Five courses required from these three areas. At least one course must be completed from each area, and no more than two courses from any one area can be applied to this requirement.
<b>UC SAN DIEGO</b> <i>B.A. International Studies</i>	Economics concentration only: MATH 1A, 1B, 1C; ECON 1A, 1B	All concentrations require four quarters of college-level courses in a modern foreign language or equivalent proficiency. Students are encouraged to complete the language requirement before transfer. All prerequisites must be taken for a letter grade of C- or better.
