CAL POLY, POMONA

B. S. in Landscape Architecture (BSLA)

The program is not impacted. In order to enter the four-year design sequence at the second year level, a portfolio review is required. Students must achieve a grade of C or better in all core courses.

Admission of transfer applicants to this major is competitive. Applications are accepted for the fall quarter only. Completion of CSU GE or IGETC, including U.S. History, Constitution, and American Ideals, is required.

UC BERKELEY

A. B. in Landscape Architecture – College of Environmental Design

All lower division major and general education/breadth requirements must be fulfilled and a minimum 3.0 overall UC transferable GPA is required for admission consideration. All courses required for admission, including breadth requirements, must be taken for a letter grade and completed by the end of the spring term that precedes fall enrollment at UCB. The College of Environmental Design will accept IGETC (full certification) for students applying in fall 2011 and beyond. The 7-Course Breadth Requirement will continue to be accepted.

Courses from Architecture, Landscape Architecture, Visual Studies, Environmental Design, Urban Studies, and City and Regional Planning may NOT be used to fulfill breadth requirements, even if they appear in the breadth lists. Courses used to meet ENV DES 1, 11A, or 11B may not be applied toward breadth requirements. No more than two courses offered by the same department may be used. Courses equivalent to the second semester of language instruction at UCB may be used to satisfy the International Studies requirement, but not courses taken in the student's native language.

UC DAVIS

B.S. in Landscape Architecture – College of Agricultural & Environmental Sciences

Apply in the "Landscape Architecture-(Pre)" on the UC application. Admission to UC Davis in pre-landscape architecture does not guarantee admission to the Landscape Architecture major. A separate portfolio application must be submitted directly to the program in February, either before or after enrollment at Davis. Minimum overall transfer GPA to be competitive is 2.80 or higher.
