B.A. in Liberal Studies – Elementary Teacher Preparation option

The Liberal Studies Elementary Teacher Preparation Degree Pathway is aligned with Content Standards for K-6 curriculum and the CSET, and is, therefore, the best preparation for future K-6 teachers. Community college courses that meet either the CSU GE-Breadth Certification or IGETC may also be used to satisfy many of the lower division requirements.

Lower Division Major Requirements:

- The Creative Process (ART 1020): no course articulated
- Intro to Biology with Lab: BIO 10
- Intro to College Chemistry: CHEM 42 or 60
- Introduction to Education: EDUC 55
- A survey course in literature that has either a cultural or geographic scope selected from:
ENGL 10, 27, 31, 33, 46.1, 46.2
- Cultural Geography: GEOG 7
- World Civilization I and II: HIST 1.1 and HIST 1.2
- Intro to Earth Sciences with Lab (GEOL 1001+1002): no courses articulated
- Health: Maintenance of Wellness (HSC 1100): no course articulated
- Number Systems (MATH 2011): no course articulated (complete a course that satisfies CSU GE Area B4 with a grade of C or better, preferably an introduction to statistics course)
- Elementary Physics with Lab: PHYS 10 + 10L
- Intro to Political Science (POSC 1000): no course articulated
- Introduction to Sociology: SOC 1
