The Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing may be earned by completing the clinical portion of the nursing curriculum at a four-year college or university, or students may complete an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) and then enroll in a degree completion program (see separate transfer major guide for NURSING (ADN TO BSN). Several CSU campuses, UCLA, and some independent California colleges and universities offer the basic nursing program that includes the clinical portion of the nursing education. Nursing program applicants may be required to complete the pre-admission **Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS)**. Check with the college or university.
