SAN JOSE STATE UNIV	POLS 1, 2, 18, 25	All majors at SJSU are impacted. Applications are reviewed and ranked by GPA. ENGL 1B or 5 or PHIL 5 or SPCH 9 = prerequisite for upper division writing. SJSU also requires 2 units of PE in at least two different activities for graduation.

SONOMA STATE UNIV	POLS 1, 2, 25 <i>are recommended but not articulated;</i> ECON 1A, 1B <i>are recommended</i>	Students are encouraged to take English composition and social science courses, including civics, economics, and history. Experience in journalism and debating can also be helpful. A foreign language is not required but highly recommended. The department encourages international study.
UC BERKELEY	<b>Two courses from:</b> POLS 1, 2, 18, 25 <b>One course from:</b> HIST 17.1, 17.2, 4.1, 4.2, 8.1, 8.2, 33	All courses must be taken for a letter grade. Complete either (1) College of L&S requirements in reading & composition, quantitative reading, & foreign language, or (2) IGETC by the end of spring term preceding fall UCB enrollment.
