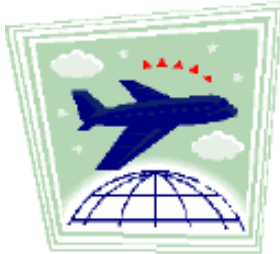

Travel Advisory



If you are planning to leave the U.S. this summer, you must get your SEVIS I-20 form signed before you leave. Without this signature, the US Immigration & Customs Enforcement may not allow you to reenter the United States. Please visit our office

before final exams begin on May 21st to obtain the required signature. Be sure you keep your important documents with you when you travel. You will need a valid passport and visa to reenter the U.S. If your passport/visa has expired, or will expire by the time you travel, you must renew it before returning to the United States. You should be prepared to show the consulate officers your I-20 form, official transcripts from SRJC, and current financial documentation. You may be asked for this information again at the airport when you return to the U.S.

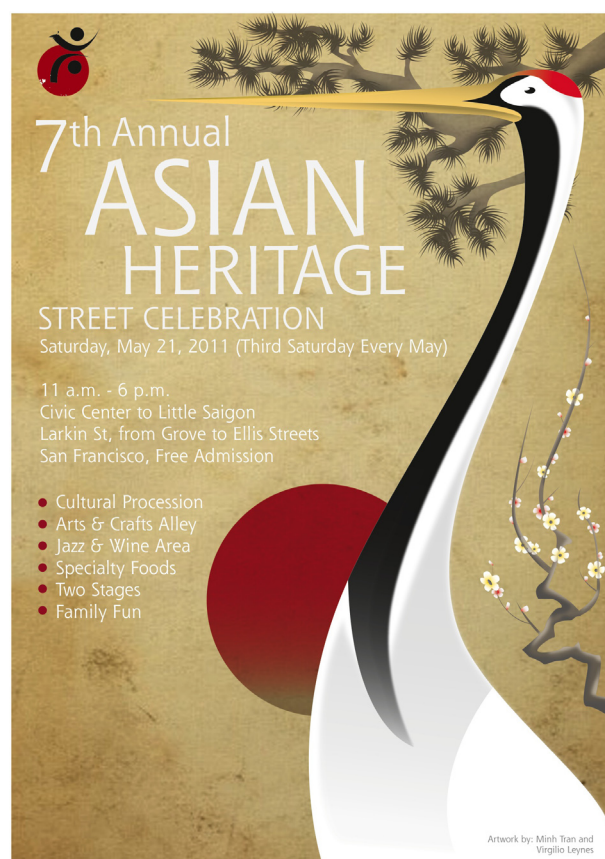
Sonoma County Fair 7/27 - 8/14
