- Only courses with grades of C- or better will transfer for undergraduate programs. Graduate students must earn a grade of B- or better in courses to be transferred as foundation courses.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ELECTIVES

The Bachelor of Science in Information Technology degree requires 24 semester units of information technology electives. These electives may be chosen from a wide variety of disciplines (including but not limited to: Computer Science, Programming, Networking, Electronic Media, Electronic Technology, Office Technology, Computer Aided Drafting/Design, Digital Art/Photography, Internet Technology). Students should choose electives to support and advance their career goals.

3. Upper Division Requirements -- as required by major

1. A maximum of 15 semester units (5 courses) would be accepted to satisfy upper division credit; of these 15 units (5 courses), a maximum of 9 units (3 courses) would be accepted to satisfy upper division courses "Required for Major."

2. The residency requirement of 21 units upper division "Required for Major" courses to be completed at Golden Gate University takes precedence here.

NOTE: Golden Gate University does not transfer upper division accounting courses from two-year schools.
