CSU General Education-Breadth Requirements and Associate Degree Option B 2008-2009

<p>SRJC will certify completion of 39 units of the 48-unit GE requirement for graduation from the CSU for students meeting the following pattern. <i>The remaining nine units must be in the upper division of the degree granting institution. A minimum of 30 units in GE, including all of Areas A and B-4, with grades of C or better in each course must be completed prior to transfer. CR is acceptable (at SRJC CR = "C" grade or better).</i></p>

2008-2009 NOTES ON CSU GENERAL EDUCATION-BREADTH REQUIREMENTS

Students having 60 transferable semester units with a "C" average (2.0) will be eligible to transfer to a California State University providing a minimum of 30 units in GE, including all of Areas A and B4, is completed with grades of C or better. SRJC courses numbered 1 - 99 will transfer to the CSU for units.

Completion of the CSU General Education Pattern (eligibility for full certification) is one option (Option B) in meeting the General Education Requirements toward earning an associate in arts or an associate in science degree at Santa Rosa Junior College. Please refer to the Associate Degree Option A worksheet, page two, for information on additional SRJC graduation requirements.

FULL Certification - Students must satisfactorily complete **39** lower-division semester units; Units must be distributed as follows:

AREA A:	9 UNITS	One course from each group: A1, A2, A3
AREA B:	9 UNITS	One course each from Physical Science (B1), Life Science (B2), Lab (B3), & Quantitative Reasoning (B4)
AREA C:	9 UNITS	Three courses to include at least one course from Arts (C1) and one course from Humanities (C2)
AREA D:	9 UNITS	Three courses must be selected from at least two different disciplines

SUBJECT-AREA Certification - Completion of one or more areas as stated above.

Students admitted to a CSU campus with full certification may not be held to additional lower division General Education Requirements. Students admitted to a CSU campus with subject-area certification may not be held to additional lower division General Education coursework in the subject areas certified. **All students will be required to complete 9 upper division General Education units after transfer to the CSU.**

Neither full certification or subject-area certification exempts students from unmet lower division graduation requirements that may exist outside of the General Education program of the campus awarding the degree.

CSU Campus Notes

CHICO	<p><u>Ethnic Studies</u> - The following courses will meet this requirement: ANTHRO 21, 32, 34, 43; CHLD 68; COMM 7; COUN 74; ENGL 22, 31, 32, 33; HIST 21, 22, 26, 30; HUMAN 6, 10.4; POLS 20; PSYCH 34; SOC 30; THAR 6.</p> <p><u>Non-Western</u> - The following courses will meet this requirement: ANTHRO 2, 3, 30, 31; ART 1.1, 1.2; ECON 30; GEOG 3, 7; HIST 8.1, 8.2, 33; HUMAN 20, 21; INTDIS 4; MUS 7.4; PHIL 8, 11. Check Chico catalog for majors that have approved GE modifications.**</p>
EAST BAY	Students may complete Area E at CSU East Bay with an upper division course.**
MONTEREY BAY	<p><u>Second Language Competence</u> - CSUMB graduation requirements suggest that upper division transfers should have completed level 3 or higher in a second language: ASL 3, ITAL 3, FREN 3, LATIN 3, GERM 3, SPAN 3.</p> <p>Students who transfer to CSUMB with Area D fully satisfied (9 units) are not required to fulfill Community Participation. All students must fulfill upper division service learning requirements within a major.</p>
SACRAMENTO	<p><u>World Civ. GE requirement</u> will be satisfied with HIST 1.1, 1.2, 4.1 or 4.2; however if Area C is certified prior to transfer, this requirement will be waived.</p> <p><u>Graduation Requirements:</u></p> <p><u>Race & Ethnicity</u> will be satisfied with COMM 7, ENGL 22, HIST 21, 22, PHIL 9, PSYCH 34 or SOC 30. These courses will also satisfy appropriate areas of GE. HIST 21 will also satisfy the U.S. History requirement.</p> <p><u>Intermediate English Composition requirement</u> can be met with ENGL 1B or 5. The revised policy (6/96) will allow these courses to double-count for CSU GE.</p> <p><u>Foreign Language Proficiency requirement</u> can be met with coursework or proficiency test (See SRJC counselor for options). For more information, see "Degree Requirements" in the CSUS catalog or contact the Foreign Language Dept. at CSUS (916) 278-6333.</p>
SAN DIEGO	<p>Complete all lower division GE by the end of the spring term prior to fall enrollment at SDSU.</p> <p>Majors leading to the Bachelor of Arts degree in liberal arts and sciences or the Bachelor of Music must satisfy foreign language proficiency by successfully completing either the 4th year level of high school or the 3rd college semester in one foreign language or by exam. See the SDSU catalog under graduation requirements for details and special conditions for certain majors.</p>
SAN FRANCISCO	<u>Basic Information Competence</u> - Students may take LIR 10 or 30 or 60A or 60B to satisfy the requirement if completed within 5 years of student's request for equivalency. ENGL 1B or 5 will meet the <u>Second Semester English requirement</u> for graduation.
SAN JOSE	GE courses completed with a CR grade must be certified. ENGL 1B (recommended for Area C2) or ENGL 5, PHIL 5, or SPCH 9 meets a prerequisite for upper division writing. Also recommend completing Area E before transfer to SJSU.
CAL POLY SLO	<u>USCP</u> (United States Cultural Pluralism requirement) can be met with HIST 21 or MUS 9. Check http://www.assist.org/ for the most recent articulation information.
SONOMA	<u>Ethnic Studies</u> can be met with ANTHRO 32, 34, 43; ENGL 22, 31, 33; HIST 21, 22, 26, 30; HUMAN 6. Students may complete an additional course in Area B at SRJC and take an upper division Area E course after transfer.**
ENGR MAJORS	Engineering majors transferring to Chico, Fresno, Humboldt, Los Angeles, Northridge, Sacramento, San Francisco, San Jose, or Cal Poly SLO are not required to complete Area A3 - Critical Thinking for admission.** Please consult individual university catalogs for other GE modifications for Engineering majors.

GE Evaluation After Transfer: You will receive an evaluation of transfer credit after you have been accepted at the CSU campus. Review your evaluation of General Education courses, and if you have questions, contact the evaluator at the CSU.
