The didjeridoo (also known as a didjeridu or didge) is a musical instrument native to the Aborigines of Northern Australia. It is sometimes described as a natural wooden trumpet or drone pipe. "Land of the Blind," an Ethnic-Exotic World Music duo from San Francisco, will perform their award-winning music and teach the didjeridoo. Dr. Krystov Bock, or "Didjeri-Doc" has been teaching didjeridoo for over twelve years. He's a healer, doctor, and inventor who believes deeply in the healing power of the deep earth vibrations of this ancient instrument. Learning to play greatly expands lung power and is very calming and meditative. Workshop includes beginning didjeridoos, breath work and hands-free set-ups for quadriplegic students.
