LeaderCenter TRAINING & STUDIES

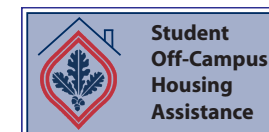
The LeaderCenter's mission is to engage students in a variety of learning opportunities to help expand their knowledge and abilities in leadership and service.
