**JOB DESCRIPTION:**

Under general supervision, perform skilled work in the repair and maintenance of related structures and physical facilities; serve as a Pool/Spa operator; and perform related work as required.

**SCOPE:**

The Pool Maintenance Technician performs a variety of complex and difficult tasks in pool maintenance.

**KEY DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

*Examples of key duties are interpreted as being descriptive and not restrictive in nature.*

1. Inspects, repairs, monitors and maintains pool equipment such as filters, chlorinators, analyzers, pumps, pool water and ozone treatment system.
2. Inspects and maintains chlorine gas alarm system.
3. Tests pool water for proper water chemistry; applies chemicals as needed.
4. Performs underwater repairs of pools with the use of underwater breathing apparatus.
5. Acid washes pool decks.
6. Brushes and vacuums pool bottom and sides; cleans tiles and washes down pool decks and diving boards.
7. Cleans and maintains shower and locker room areas.
8. Maintains appropriate service and repair records.
9. Maintains storage and inventory of equipment parts, supplies and chemicals.
10. Purchases equipment parts, supplies and chemicals.
11. Responds to routine and emergency calls for repairs and service.
12. Assist other Skilled Maintenance Workers as required.

**EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS**

**ABILITY TO:**

Operate and use required tools and equipment skillfully and safely; perform physical labor; operate a public swimming pool; maintain pool in accordance with prescribed standards; maintain schedules required for proper pool maintenance; perform normal maintenance and cleaning services of pool and related areas; follow and give oral and written instructions; maintain cooperative relationships; demonstrate sensitivity to, and respect for, a diverse population.

**KNOWLEDGE OF:**

Tools, materials, methods and terminology used in the construction trades; methods and practices followed in the maintenance of tools, machinery, and equipment; safety precautions to be observed in the use of tools and materials; applicable code requirements.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:**

*Candidates/incumbents must meet the minimum qualifications as detailed below, or file for equivalency. Equivalency decisions are made on the basis of a combination of education and experience that would likely provide the required knowledge and abilities. If requesting consideration on the basis of equivalency, an Equivalency Application is required at the time of interest in a position (equivalency decisions are made by Human Resources, in coordination with the department where the vacancy exists, if needed.)*

*Education:*

Graduation from high school.

*Experience:*

Four years relevant experience.

**PREFERRED:**

Experience in metal fabrication (welding).

**LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE:**

This classification requires the use of a personal or District vehicle while conducting District business. Must possess a valid (Class C) California driver's license and an acceptable driving record. Forklift operation certification. Required to possess a current Pool/Spa Operator Certificate and/or National Swimming Pool Foundation Certificate, and Self Contained Breathing Apparatus and Diving Certificate.

**SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:**

Must be able to perform physical activities, such as, but not limited to, lifting equipment (up to 50 lbs. unassisted), bending, standing, climbing or walking. Must be able to safely use manual tools and power equipment common in the trade. Must be able to handle hazardous materials safely and tolerate exposure to chemicals and solutions.
