## **United Way Campaign Exceeds Goal**

Director of Admissions & Enrollment Diane Traversi, who coordinated this year's United Way Campaign, reports that SRJC's Employee Pledge Drive for 2009 was a smashing success. Contributions increased the college's annual pledge amount by 9.2 percent - or \$2,900 - over last year's pledged amount!

Last year – 124 donors donated an annual total of \$ 31,829; 17 of the existing donors increased their monthly pledge by 10 percent or greater.

This year – 142 donors contributed an annual total of \$ 34,729; plus there were 18 first-time donors.

## Employee of the Month December 2008 Anita Rich

Congratulations to Anita Rich, Administrative Assistant III for Arts, Humanities, Behavioral and Social Sciences, for being selected the Santa Rosa Junior College Employee of the Month for December 2008. Anita was introduced by her supervisor Tyra Benoit, Dean of Arts, Humanities and Behavioral & Social Sciences, at the December 9, 2008, Board of Trustees meeting. She was presented with an EOM plaque, season tickets to SRT performances, gift vouchers from the Culinary Café, and other tokens of appreciation from coworkers.

"Anita is a true pleasure to work with – she can always be depended on to put forth her very best effort. She has never been late doing a project that has been assigned to her and is extremely punctual to meetings. She takes the initiative and is always eager to learn something new. She then shares this newfound knowledge freely with others. If she can do something to help a coworker or a student, she will," Tyra says.

As the Administrative Assistant for the largest instructional cluster at the College, which includes Art, Communication Studies, Behavioral Sciences, Social Sciences, Music, Theatre Arts, Philosophy, and Humanities, Anita's key tasks include: curricula review, data mining, processing evaluations, scheduling meetings, and coordinating with faculty and classified staff from all departments to ensure a well-organized, efficient, and connected department. "As the unofficial curriculum coordinator, Anita maintains a watchful eye on curricular revisions and new course proposals to make sure that all appropriate paperwork is completed," Ty emphasizes. "She was first to become an expert with the new CATS curriculum system, and she eagerly embraces every challenge and never rests until a project is finished." Anita also personally tutors coworkers on the CATS system, Convergence, and data mining, as needed.

Among the skills that make Anita highly effective in her role, her dedication to team is a key strength. "Anita's work ethic goes far beyond her job description and she always chips in to help others get a project done," Ty says. In many cases Anita goes above and beyond to support the department. During the recent PRPP process, for example, she became the resident expert about the process, field testing the program and assisting chairs and other administrative assistants across the cluster with full implementation into Convergence. Her detailed approach works to improve the system and she shares any insights and suggestions with others to make the team stronger. "She is the consummate professional and always stays on task, often losing herself in a project," Tyra adds. "At times, I have to make sure that she lets something go until the next day because she always wants to complete it before going home, no matter the project's size."

Anita also consistently demonstrates a strong commitment to students. Ever concerned that students from all backgrounds are well-served by the College, she often mentors those who need help. She arranges tutoring for students in specific

classes, while also tutoring some students herself. Courteous and understanding, she assists at other service centers, and works diligently to ensure that students are informed on current dates and activities related to their classes. When the Service Center staff is stretched very thin, Anita provides support in any way that's needed to serve the students or help them resolve challenges. She also helps hearing-impaired students in the ASL Department so they readily find their instructors and offices. "She is able to see the big picture and understands that our greatest responsibility is to help students get a quality education," says Ty.

Born in Detroit, Michigan, Anita attended Northeastern High School, earned a bachelor's of arts at Michigan State University.

In 1985 she served in the U.S. Coast Guard and was stationed in Two Rock for four years. When leaving the military she decided to remain in Northern California, and worked for Cole Publishing Company in Santa Rosa. In 1991 she joined SRJC's staff as a Lab Assistant in the Business Office Tehnology Lab, a position she held through 2004. Having advanced through various positions, she assumed her current position in 2005, working for both Deans Kris Abrahamson and Ty Benoit.

Anita attributes her success at SRJC to being "surrounded by so many people who are conscientious, ethical, and who work very hard." Her greatest accomplishment has been "Being able to make the transition from lab assistant to administrative assistant." She notes that her greatest challenge is having been "honed in the military, which is very directive; sometimes I'm not as inquisitive

as I should be about process or something that may be out of the ordinary. It's a problem for me. But thank goodness my occasional lack of follow through hasn't presented too many problems because my supervisor and other people are so knowledgeable." What Anita likes most about her job, "Every moment is a learning moment and many times it may not involve the job at hand. There are bright people here and this particular cluster involves so many disciplines and their subsets - music, theatre, humanities, behavioral sciences, forensics, social sciences, art, and philosophy. It's a candy store of passions, values, and ideas!"

Outside of work Anita is an active citizen and often attends City Council meetings to be informed about the current events. She attends college activities, plays, lectures, and presentations. Most recently, she attended a Leader Center workshop on recruiting and retaining African American students. She has volunteered for the Sonoma County and Healdsburg animal shelters and the House Rabbit Society Headquarters in Richmond. She especially enjoys her animal companions - past and present - including dogs, cats, bunnies, and guinea pigs. Anita has a sister who currently lives in Detroit.

When she was told of her Employee of the Month nomination, her reaction, "Surprise! This is really an honor." Congratulations, Anita, for being selected SRJC's Employee of the Month.
