
Planetarium Presents Stories From The Stars



Paintings Exhibited by Women of India on the Petaluma Campus

The Petaluma Campus will display paintings on handmade paper by Hindu women from Northern India January 17 through February 24 in the Mahoney Library. Free to the public, the exhibit will be open Monday-Thursday, 8:00 AM to 9:00 PM; Fridays from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM; and Saturdays from 10:00 AM to 3:00 PM (except school holidays).

A prolonged drought in the 1960s created a major economic crisis in the community. To create a source of non-agricultural income, the All-India Handicrafts Board encouraged women and their female children to produce traditional paintings, revitalizing the ancient tradition. 
