Vision Service Plan Open Enrollment 2007

During October 2007, SRJC employees may in the District vision plan. Eligible employees include:

Classified employees with an FTE of 50% or greater

Management employees with an FTE of 50% or greater

Contract Faculty with an FTE of 60% or greater

If you've waived your vision coverage in the past, you can now enroll. Eligible employees can also enroll their dependents at this time if they have previously waived dependent vision coverage. The District pays for employee-only coverage for all Management and Faculty members. If you are a Management or Faculty member, premiums for dependent coverage will be deducted from your paycheck. The dependent premium deduction amounts are:

Management \$14.50 per month over 12 paychecks

Faculty \$17.40 per month over 10 paychecks

Vision coverage election forms are attached. Forms must be completed and returned to Human Resources by October 31, 2007. The coverage will become effective January 1, 2008. Contact Louise Burke with questions at ext. 4304.

Health Benefits Open Enrollment

Santa Rosa Junior College will replace the current Health Net coverage with a Blue Shield PPO plan. Health Net coverage will end December 31, 2007. If you are currently a Health Net member, you must complete a new enrollment form to participate in either Blue Shield or Kaiser Permanente. If you are currently a Kaiser member and wish to remain with Kaiser, no action on your part is necessary.

During October, all eligible employees can switch from one health provider to another. If you've waived medical coverage in the past you may enroll now! Eligible employees include:

Classified employees with an FTE of 50% or greater

Management employees with an FTE of 50% or greater

Contract Faculty with an FTE of 60% or greater

Adjunct Faculty who met eligibility requirements in September 2007

Informational packets can be picked up in the Human Resources Department. Enrollment forms must be completed and returned to Human Resources by October 31. The coverage you elect will remain in effect January 1, 2008, through September 30, 2008. We will move to a new contract period beginning October 1, 2008. Anna Felciano - Employee of the Month October 2007

Congratulations to Anna Felciano, Administrative Assistant II in Facilities Operations, for being nominated Santa Rosa Junior College Employee of the Month for October 2007. Anna was introduced at the October 9 Board of Trustees meeting by her supervisor Jay Carpenter, Director, Facilities Operations, and received an EOM plaque, season tickets to SRT, gift vouchers from the Culinary Café, and other gifts from her colleagues. "Anna is an outstanding member of our department. She is the nerve center of departmental administration, is always organized and professional, but remains good humored and pleasant even in high stress situations," Jay emphasizes.

Hired by SRJC as an STNC in November 1987, Anna became a permanent employee in July 1988, working in Community Education through November 2001, the year she assumed her current position in Facilities Operations. In her current role, Anna's key responsibilities include doing the requisitions for materials for the maintenance department, sending crafts workers on calls for maintenance, and tracking the assignment of keys and other maintenance-related tasks. "Anna is a problem solver, always calm and directed. She learns new processes and assignments very quickly and then improves them innovatively," says Jay.

In addition to ensuring smooth running office operations, Anna organizes most of the department's gatherings, including holiday dinners, retirements, birthdays, and other milestone events in employees' lives. "Anna is always cheerful, upbeat, optimistic, helpful, and friendly with everyone in the department and the public," notes Jay. She demonstrates her commitment to students and the college through her mentorship of student workers and her dedication to College employees. "Anna is a friend and mentor to many of our students, and her commitment to fellow employees is clearly shown by her willingness to serve as President of the Classified Senate, by working on the accreditation process, and by serving on numerous hiring committees," Jay emphasizes.

When asked about her greatest accomplishment at SRJC, Anna responds that it was becoming President of the Classified Senate, a position she currently holds. "I have been involved in the Senate since its beginning in 1994 as a Senator, then Treasurer, and now as President. I feel it is an important part of the shared governance process at SRJC." What she likes most about her job is working with the maintenance staff. "They are a great bunch people!" She attributes her success at SRJC to "really loving the JC and what it does for students. It is great to have an outstanding educational institution in our back yard. I am always telling kids that this is the place to start your higher education path."

Born in San Francisco, Anna grew up in Geyserville, and graduated from Geyserville High School in 1981. "I have lived in Sonoma County my whole life," she notes. Anna attended Empire College, where she earned a diploma in bookkeeping and data entry. She continues to take classes at SRJC and intends to graduate in spring 2008.

A single mother, Anna's 19-year-old son, Nathaniel, is a student at SRJC. In her personal time she loves reading especially. "My son tells me I have my nose in a book all the time." Sharing her house with her mother, Anna also spends much time with her sister in Geyserville, her brother from Forestville, and her three nieces and one nephew. "I really enjoy spending time with friends and family and watching the kids play sports."

An interesting side note: Anna's grandfather, Clarence Felciano, was a well-known architect in Sonoma County who designed Shuhaw Hall, Bailey Hall, and Barnett Hall. "It is said that the reason he became an architect is because Floyd Bailey convinced him he could pass math and encouraged him to go on to UC Berkeley," Anna recalls.

Outside of work, Anna leads a busy life with much community involvement. "She was elected to the Geyserville Unified School Board, where she continues her longstanding dedication to community service," Jay says. She is also the President of the Board at the Geyserville Christian Church, where she recently became

a minister and performed her first wedding ceremony this summer. An active volunteer at the Geyserville High School Bronco Booster Club, Anna was also a cheerleading coach for Geyserville High for four years. Other volunteer work includes serving as a basketball official, fund raising coordinator, event planner, a bus driver, member of the Site Council for the Geyserville School District, as well as the parent group that helped with accreditation. "I have driven for many field trips and sporting events. I help out with the Cloverdale Pony Tail Softball and assist at many community events, including Fall Colors and the May Day Celebration, often cooking and serving at chamber events." This year Anna also used her vacation time to travel to Kazakhstan to assist a friend who was adopting a child.

"Anna is such an important and valued member of the Facilities Team. She's popular with students and staff and the general public, and we feel very lucky to have her," Jay says. When she was told of her nomination as Employee of the Month, she responded "I was shocked. You know, you go along doing your job thinking no one notices, but they do!
