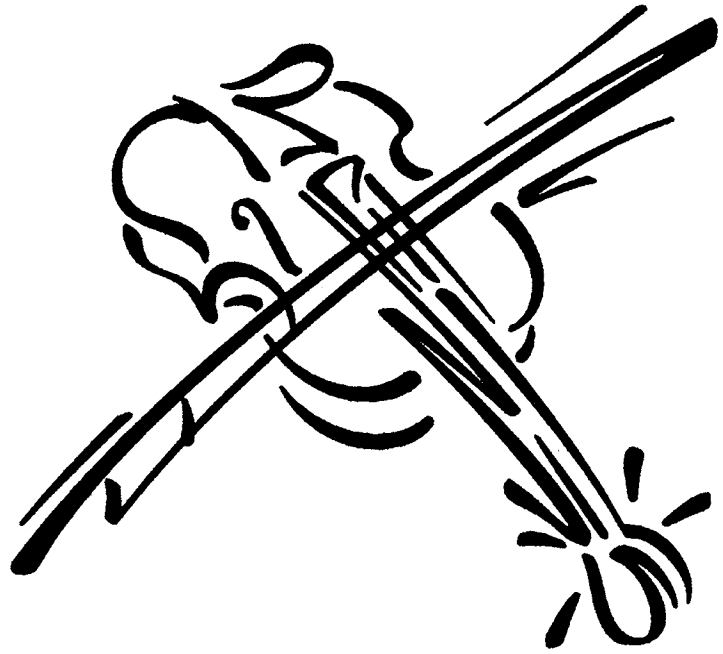

## Call for PDA Presenters: SRJC: A Learning-Centered Community



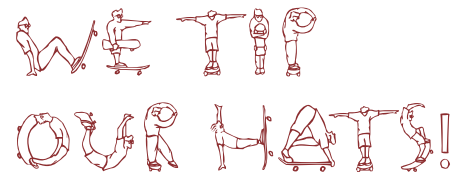

SRJC Diesel Fuel Instructor Mark Armstrong, who teaches alternative fuel shop classes, was spotlighted in a lengthy article in the March 16, 2008, Sunday *San Francisco Chronicle Magazine* titled "Mark Armstrong's Alternative Fuel Philosophy: If you don't like the vehicle or the fuel it drinks, make some of your own." Mark and his students have converted five cars to run on vegetable oil, one on ethanol, as well as upgraded dozens to run on biodiesel. The classes Mark developed focus on "creating a professional network that will enable anyone to kick the petroleum habit." As one of Sonoma County's "green pioneers," Mark offers a three-pronged alternative fuels plan, which is outlined in the *Chronicle's* article at <http://www.sfgate.com/cgi-bin/article.cgi?f=/c/a/2008/03/16/CMC1U1GJ6.DTL>.
