Mary Kay recommends to SRJC staff who are looking to lead a healthy lifestyle to "find an activity that would be convenient and you can do - set it for success. And find a buddy to do it with."

Employee of the Month Christine Nora March 2009

Congratulations to Christine Nora, Executive Assistant to the Vice President for Administrative Services, for being nominated the Santa Rosa Junior College Employee of the Month for March 2009. Christine was introduced by her supervisor Dr. Curt Groninga, Vice President Administrative Services/Assistant Superintendent, at the March 10, 2009, Board of Trustees meeting. She was presented with an EOM plaque, season tickets to SRT performances, gift vouchers from the Culinary Café, and other gifts of appreciation. "Christine works with many SRJC staff, college consultants, and community members and consistently represents the best of Santa Rosa Junior College. Quietly diligent, Christine has always provided added value to the Administrative Services mission and purpose. We are all fortunate to have the opportunity to work with her," Curt says.

In her position, Christine's key tasks including coordinating numerous complex activities involving legal contracts, property acquisitions, meetings, conferences, committees, and many special projects, such as archiving documents for the College and ensuring that all facets of the high visibility component area runs efficiently. Her role is instrumental to major projects, such as helping assemble SRJC's Annual Five-Year Capital Outlay Plan, preparing the seemingly endless number of Administrative Service Board Agenda Items, and providing key administrative support to the Institutional Planning Council (IPC) and the Board Facilities Committee (BFC).

Many comment on a unique quality that makes Christine outstanding in her role: her ability to remain calm, focused, and effective in the face of challenges. "Amidst the frequently frenetic pace of the Administrative Services office, a serene presence is found in Christine who performs her key responsibilities with professional efficiency," emphasizes Curt. Maria Gaitan, Executive Assistant to the Superintendent/President, adds, "Christine and I work closely on various tasks that are often very time sensitive. She always amazes me with her ability to stay calm, when clearly, there is turbulence around her. I appreciate her easy-going style and I value her as a friend and colleague." When streams of architects, engineers, construction managers, and contractors who are immersed in college construction projects drop by Administrative Services to resolve project issues, Christine's calming influence is invaluable. Once when Curt asked Christine if she'd "ever been accused of being too noisy," she softly responded, "No, but my mother did accuse me of being too bossy! Well, I guess that part of me went underground. I may be quiet, but I'm always thinking!"

Christine joined SRJC's staff in 1998 as the Administrative Assistant III for Administrative Services. She started the position out with a bang when she was assigned to help submit critical funding documents and plans for several

major SRJC projects, including the Doyle Library and Petaluma Phase II. After several years in her position, Christine was promoted to her current position as Executive Assistant. When asked what she attributes to her success at SRJC, she responds, "I love my job and the department I work for. Everyday I am challenged to learn more about the College and my function in it. I respect and admire my boss and the other people who work with me. That kind of support has helped me to succeed in my duties." She identifies her greatest accomplishment at SRJC as: "I have always had the desire to teach, and through Community Education I have had an opportunity to teach a class at SRJC in Children's Book Writing and Illustrating. This indirectly relates to my position as an Executive Assistant because in that role I gained so much confidence that I parlayed that into achieving a personal goal."



What she likes most about her job, "Having a small role in building the Doyle Library and other new buildings that have been built since I began working at SRJC. I have experienced a renaissance of building at this College that will extend far into the future." What may surprise others most about Christine: "I'm an author and artist and I teach a Community Education class in my spare time." To her friends and coworkers, Christine's gracious attitude and sense of humor - no matter how heavy the workload is - are invaluable: "Christine is a great balancer. She is good with boundaries, but always with kindness," says Bill Shelley, Petaluma Campus Library Technician. "She's got

a fantastic work ethic, but she values taking a deep breath and taking time to be a friend."

Born in Long Beach, California, Christina graduated from Long Beach Polytechnic High School and attended Long Beach City College, Santa Rosa Junior College, and Cal State University, Long Beach where she earned a bachelor's degree in creative writing. Before working at SRJC Christine was employed at Scott Paper Company and Sony Corporation. Christina was drawn to Sonoma County in 1996 because "I've always loved Northern California and had an opportunity to relocate from Southern California." Outside of work Christine enjoys trips to Yosemite, Greece, and Italy to paint watercolors, being a part of the local art community, participating in writing consortia, hiking in the woods and coastal areas, and cooking and serving unique dishes to unsuspecting friends. Cochlear Implant & Hearing Loss Support Group Trainings Jan-May

Free, noncredit trainings are offered on the Santa Rosa Campus to provide education and support to adults with hearing loss. Students, parents, and community members are invited to attend trainings that are held in Room 4245 of the Doyle Library from 6:00 to 8:00 PM that focus on topics ranging from cochlear implants and overcoming communication challenges to hearing aids, loop systems, and other technology.

Captioning/transcribing and assistive listening devices will be available at each meeting. Daily parking permits are required parking lot machines for \$3.00 per day. These activities are sponsored by the Disability Resources Department.

March 18 - CTAP - Skippy Sumner from California Technology Assistance Program (CTAP) will review the latest technology available to individuals with hearing loss to improve telephone communication and how to access a free phone that meet particular needs.

April 15 - Cochlear Americas - Linda Day, Manager of the Cochlear Awareness Network for Cochlear Americas, will review current cochlear implants research and technology. A cochlear implant technology teacher, Linda supports individuals who have or may be cochlear implant candidates.

May 13 - New CI Users Panel - New CI Users Panel - Informational panel discussion by individuals who have received cochlear implant within the past year. Participants learn firsthand about their experiences and decision-making process.




