## Mandatory Time Off 2010/2011

The Mandatory Time Off Task Force made various recommendations regarding the implementation of MTO, which have been approved by the Administration, including:

1. College closure will be on the following days: **NOVEMBER 24; DECEMBER 20, 21, 22 AND 23; MARCH 21, 22, 23, 24 AND 25.** Usual vacation requests for additional time off near these periods will be given appropriate consideration.
1. **EMPLOYEES SHOULD SCHEDULE THE REMAINING FOUR HOURS OFF,** with a strong emphasis on using the time during low-service days.
2. For employees not scheduled to work the dates identified in 1 above, yearly work calendars will be reviewed and mandated time off arranged through consultation between the employee and the supervisor. A form will be completed by the employee and supervisor and will be submitted to Human Resources.
3. For departments that cannot close during the times outlined above, area management will consult with area employees and propose a schedule. This schedule will incorporate days from (1) above as much as possible along with additional defined days of closure or days of reduced scheduling. Full days of closure, or at least half days, are strongly recommended. These plans will then be submitted to the Component Administrator and President for approval.

Please note that members of the college community who are intending to retire or resign this year are in need of MTO implementation information as soon as possible to finalize their plans. How MTO implementation will affect their retirement or resignation should be discussed individually with Louise Burke in Human Resources at ext. 4304.

Student Psychological Services (SPS) has consolidated mental health services for students on the Santa Rosa Campus in Plover Hall (559 - the northwest wing). To make an appointment with Student Psychological Services, students may come to the daily drop-in services at 2:00 PM, or, if they made an SPS appointment on the phone, they can access their services in Plover.

Student Psychological Services (SPS) and the College's Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) mental health services grant have had offices in this section of Plover for awhile. Moving the SPS direct services supports more effective mental health programs for students. During summer at the Plover location, the "Welcome Center for New Students" is provided by Student Affairs.

Appointments from across the college may be made for any Student Health Services at the Plover office.

Also available are over-the-counter items, informational brochures about health topics, and referrals to community health-care services.

There we'll discover the southern sky and such things as the Magellanic Clouds, Southern Cross, Alpha Centauri, and the brightest regions of the Milky Way.
