Subchapter 3

Article 2: 18087

In order to continue receiving child care services at the Campus Laboratory School, parents who receive a state subsidy for child development services must maintain satisfactory academic progress. The Children's Center will adhere to all conditions regarding eligibility and academic progress as defined in the Education Code, Title 5:Article 2 18087.

1. All subsidized recipients of child care services must earn a GPA of 2.0 or better.
2. All subsidized recipients must demonstrate continued progress toward academic or vocational goals by completing successfully at least 50% of all attempted units each semester at SRJC.
3. A family shall be eligible for child development services for six years from the initiation of services; or 24 units after the attainment of a Bachelors Degree.
4. Subsidized recipients must demonstrate continued progress toward academic or vocational goals by enrolling in and successfully completing a minimum of six units at SRJC each semester.

The first time the parent does not meet the conditions of academic progress listed, the parent may continue to receive services for one additional semester to improve their progress. At the conclusion of that semester, the parent shall, in the classes for which subsidized care was provided, have made adequate progress, as defined above. If the parent has not made adequate progress, services shall be terminated.

If a parent is terminated for lack of academic progress, the parent may re-apply for services by placing their name on the waiting list. They shall not be admitted until at least six months from the date of termination.
