NATIVE OAK AND LANDMARK TREE PROTECTION

ADOPT: AUGUST 14, 1989

REVIEWED: DECEMBER 12, 2000

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The Board of Trustees recognizes that any earth disturbance within the drip line of a native oak or other tree can and frequently will result in the inevitable decline of that tree. The Board establishes a policy that no avoidable earth disturbance due to construction, compaction, grading, excavation or earth removal will be allowed within the drip line of any oak or other preservable landmark tree now existing on District property.

It will be District policy and practice that any proposed construction activities be closely reviewed for possible impacts upon native oak and landmark trees, and that these impacts will be mitigated through design review by appropriate District staff. Any proposed construction activities will adhere to written procedures constraining construction impacts upon native oak and landmark trees.
