**ALCOHOL AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE TESTING
FOR DRIVERS OF CERTAIN DISTRICT VEHICLES**

The Sonoma County Junior College District will comply with the regulations, requirements, and suggested guidelines put forth in the Omnibus Transportation Act of 1991 and The Transportation and Related Agencies Appropriations Act of 1992.

The use of, or being under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance while on District property or engaged in activities endorsed, sponsored, or supported by the District is prohibited (see District Policy 6.8.4). In addition, employees who drive or provide safety sensitive functions relating to certain vehicles are subject to random testing for alcohol and/or controlled substances. In general this group of employees includes those who operate vehicles with a capacity of 16 or more passengers or with a gross vehicle weight of 26,001 pounds or more. Also included are those employees who provide safety-sensitive functions for such vehicles.

Specific definitions regarding random testing, as well as the procedures related to testing, reporting, and record keeping are based on the transportation acts cited in this policy.
