Admissions & Records Administrative Procedures

I. General Guidelines

Education Code 76140.5 permits a college to classify non-resident Police Academy enrollees as residents for tuition purposes. This residency classification applies only to coursework directly related to police academy training.

II. Eligibility and Requirements

- A. Each prospective police academy enrollee must meet the established entrance requirements of the College's police academy training program.
- B. A public agency must submit written assurance that the eligible non-resident student will be employed as a peace officer in California upon successful completion of police academy training. This written assurance will be submitted to the Director of the SRJC Public Safety Training Center for consideration and approval.
- C. The SRJC Admissions Offices will properly classify approved non-resident applicants and maintain original written assurances in the eligible student's permanent record.
- D. Eligible students are responsible to pay any other required fee associated with their enrollment in the College.
