Famous for its churches, museums, architecture, and world famous art works, Florence is also a modern city throbbing with Italian vitality, a city for the young at heart with cafes, shops and cinemas to add to the unique academic experience of a semester abroad. In Florence students get to see

for themselves the taste, the elegance, and aesthetic sensibility that marked the Renaissance. Living and studying where the rebirth of creativity began five centuries ago is inspiring; art, history and language come alive in the great Italian tradition.
