Part 1: Instructor webcasts

Watch the webcasts listed under Week 5 at the class website. There is a link to the Adobe website that discusses Adobe history and the important of PostScript. It's worth watching.

The last webcast on text wrapping works with the class website from last semester. It has since been updated to include additional graphics for your use. To preview these graphics available for download at the current class website without having to open up Photoshop or Illustrator, there is a PDF file that include thumbnails of each graphic with the corresponding filename. You do not need to download all of the graphics — pick out the ones that interest you and import into InDesign.

Feel free to be creative as you work on this lab, as long as you do a rectangular text wrap on a photograph on the first page and a contour wrap on a vector graphic on the second page.

Export your Lab5 InDesign document as a smallest size PDF and submit through CATE.
