Top SRJC Student Receives CCC Phi Theta Kappa Awards and SRJC Outstanding Student Award

SRJC student Brian Wong was one of 71 top community college students from 36 colleges recognized on April 11 at the Sacramento Library Galleria in Sacramento. The annual awards ceremony is sponsored by the Community College League of California and the Community College Foundation, and recognizes scholarly achievements and leadership accomplishments of students enrolled in community colleges around California. The selected students represent some of the best of the 2.5 million students enrolled in California's 108 community colleges. Teams were determined by the scores nominees received from Phi Theta Kappa judges at the national level. Brian was ranked on the second of three teams of awardees, and received a medallion of honor and a certificate for outstanding grades, leadership, and community service.

Brian was also honored at the April 9 Board Meeting by the Trustees as the recipient of the Outstanding Student Award.

SRJC Academic Senate President Dr. Brenda Flyswithhawks is the recipient of the 2002 John W. Rice Diversity Award presented at the CCC Board of Governors and Chancellor's Office annual conference at the Hyatt Regency San Francisco Airport in Burlingame on April 10. Dr. Flyswithhawks was selected as an honoree because of the significant, outstanding, and ongoing contributions she has made toward the advancement of faculty and staff diversity and student equity.

Dr. Flyswithhawks, a Psychology Instructor and noted campus and community speaker, joined SRJC in 1990. A member of the eastern band of the Tsalagi (Cherokee) Nation, she has served on numerous equity and diversity committees and scholarship programs for minorities. She is the coordinator of the Seeking Educational Equity and Diversity (SEED) Project, a professional development program for faculty, and is comanager of the national educators training for the SEED Project. She is a consultant to the Center for Research on Women at Wellesley College and an international lecturer on legal, educational, and mental health issues of the American Indian people.
